## Value

*Kiplinger* (2019) and *Money* (2020) both named Clemson a **best-value college**.

In Fall 2020, in-state first-year students paid an average **42 percent of tuition and fees**.

**51%** of first-year students received an **institutional recruiting scholarship**, Fall 2020.

**98%** of first-time in-state students receive state scholarships.

**A majority of Clemson's graduates (53%) have no debt** compared to the state (40%) and national (42%) averages.
